AFTER SCHOOL CONVERSATIONS:

Do you find yourself on the way home from school in the afternoon listening to every moan and groan about your child's school day? Sometimes we can unintentionally develop a pattern where the question, "So how was your day?" is met with negative responses, whinges and complaints.

On a daily basis, this not only makes you feel concerned and worried about how your child is going at school, but also pretty frazzled! Most often, your child's day has not been bad at all, but as their safe and trusted parent/carer, they are saving the worst stories of the day for you.

Listening to your child's worries is important, but it's equally important that we teach them to focus on what has gone well in their day.

Try starting the trip home with some of these questions instead and notice the difference it makes.

- What was the best thing that happened today?
- Give me the two top things you did at school today
- What made you laugh today?
- What did you learn today that you didn't know yesterday?
- What made you smile today?

MOBILE PHONES

We encourage all students to leave mobile phones at home – we do however accept that some parents give their children mobile phones to enable them to be contacted OUTSIDE of school time. Any student bringing a mobile phone to school is required to turn it off on arrival at school and to hand it in to the school office. Students can collect their phone from the office at the end of the school day.

MOVING FORWARD AIMING HIGH

1. ERG Committees: The five committees have continued with their meetings, priority plans and forward planning for term two. Here are some of the highlights.

<u>Teaching and Learning:</u> The school's Assessment Schedule (over the various curricula areas) was revised, added to and updated. The staff had input into our Literacy and Numeracy Frameworks and these have been utilised this term, with the committee ensuring whole school consistency from K-6. The teaching staff has continued to receive collaborative sessions with our curriculum advisor, Mel Jennings. <u>Learning Environment:</u> The committee has continued their work on policies relating to Behaviour Management, Students At Educational Risk, Individual Education Plans, end of the year Hand Over plans and incorporating the school's Virtues, Choose Respect and Friendly Schools programmes. <u>Leadership:</u> Mr Paul Heenan will visit our school next term to continue with training on performance management and peer observation/collaboration formats. Lisa Gibson will continue to visit all classrooms.

In the next newsletter the Relationships and Resources committees will be featured.

- 2. NQS: Miss Francis and I will meet with K-2 staff early next term to reflect upon our school's ongoing improvements in the National Quality Standards.
- **3.** On Entry (PP-2): Some of the K-2 teaching staff attended a course on the "On Entry Data Analysis" and all K-2 staff then had the opportunity to collaborate last Friday.
- 4. **PBS:** The team met last week and began discussing behavioural definitions for our school matrix. We also discussed ideas for term two including our motto and logo planning.
- 5. **POL:** On Monday afternoon, the 20th March, the Phases of Learning teams combined to experience a presentation by Diana Rigg (Educator and author). This course gave the staff opportunities to expand their knowledge and application of the Diana Rigg Spelling and Phonics programme which is utilised at our school. Ms Rigg has recently updated her reference books and these were presented to teaching staff.
